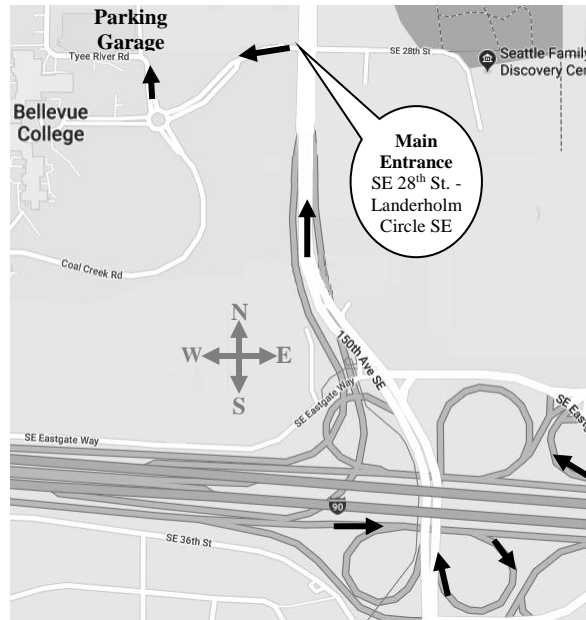

### **From 405 or I-5:**

Take I-90 eastbound. Take Exit 11A and follow the freeway signs to Eastgate Way. The ramp will merge you onto **150th** (148<sup>th</sup>) Ave. SE heading north. Proceed through the first stoplight (SE Eastgate Way) and continue up the hill. Move into the left lane as soon as possible. At the next stoplight (SE 28th St.), turn left into the Bellevue College MAIN ENTRANCE.

### **From Issaquah:**

Take I-90 westbound to Exit 11. After exiting, follow the freeway signs; first, for 150th Ave. SE and then, for Eastgate Way. At the stoplight, turn left onto Eastgate Way. Move into the right lane and turn right at **150th** (148<sup>th</sup>) Ave. SE. Proceed up the hill and move into the left lane as soon as possible. At the stoplight (SE 28th St.), turn left into the Bellevue College MAIN ENTRANCE.

### **MAIN ENTRANCE to PARKING GARAGE:**

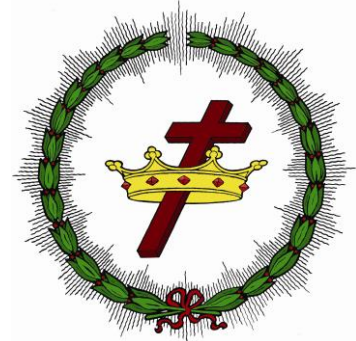
Proceed to the Parking Garage (see arrows above). **Walk west to the Cafeteria (C-Building)** by using the campus **Parking Map**:

## PANEL QUESTIONS

### OUR WARFARE WITH THE WORLD, THE FLESH AND THE DEVIL

#### THE ADVERSARY

1. In the course of our warfare, how does the Adversary use the world and our flesh against us? (James 1:13-15; Nov 25 Manna). Does 1 Peter 5:8 imply an intelligent malice against us? Knowing these things, what is the best way to resist the Adversary? (James 4:7). Give Scriptural examples and/or practical advice.

2. What is the “hour of temptation” (Revelation 3:10) and why is it important for us to recognize the special trials that must be endured during this period? What are those special trials and how do we overcome them?

#### THE WORLD

3. How are we influenced by the world? Is it subtle or blatant? If the things which the world promotes are not sinful, does that make them OK for us? (1 Corinthians 6:12; 10:23). What does it mean to be “in the world, but not of it”? (2 Corinthians 6:17).

4. What does it mean to “overcome” worldly thoughts and attitudes and how do we do so? (1 John 4:1-6; 5:4-5). Give some specific, Scriptural ways in which we might counteract the influence of the world upon us (for example: Hebrews 12:13).

#### THE FLESH

5. Many of the brethren have suffered from overwhelming feelings of discouragement or even guilt—we continue to beat ourselves up over current or past failures. How do we overcome these feelings?

6. How important is self-control over the flesh to the New Creature and what are some specific ways in which we might gain it? (R5652; R4517; R5487). How important is patient endurance in our battle with the flesh, the world, and the Adversary? (R5650; R5332).

7. What advice would you give to someone walking in this narrow way about our battle against the world, the flesh, and the Adversary? What technique(s) have helped you most? What Scriptures have been most meaningful to you?
